#### § Confession of Sin

#### based on Romans 6:1-14

Father, we confess that we have not lived in the light of the Gospel. Instead of walking in the light of your grace, we have willfully continued to sin. We have failed to understand the power of grace that is operative in our lives. Rather than remembering our identity in Christ, we most often embrace the pattern of this world. We have forgotten that we are no longer in Adam and that our old self has been crucified with Christ. We have forgotten that in Christ we have died to sin and are now alive to God. Even this week we have failed to recall our union with Christ and that He has broken sin's power. We confess that we have not deeply considered the freedom that Christ purchased for us, nor have we truly lived in a manner worthy of our new standing in Christ. Have mercy upon us and help us to remember that we are now dead to sin and alive to you as your beloved children and coheirs with Christ Jesus. Amen

#### § Assurance of Pardon

Romans 8:1-4

There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death. Westminster Larger Catechism, Q&A 75

**Leader**: What is sanctification?

## Hearing from the Savior

Sermon Text Romans 6:1-14

What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? <sup>2</sup> By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? <sup>3</sup> Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? <sup>4</sup> We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

<sup>5</sup> For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. <sup>6</sup> We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. <sup>7</sup> For one who has died has been set free from sin. <sup>8</sup> Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. <sup>9</sup> We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. <sup>10</sup> For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. <sup>11</sup> So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

## Questions for Families and Community Groups

## Read Romans 6:1-14 again and consider the following questions:

- 1. In Romans 6:1-2 What problem is Paul addressing? Have you ever fallen into thinking either 1) sin is no big deal or 2) you will not be able to make progress in sanctification?
- 2. Why is our new identity in Christ contrary to a life of willful sin against God?
- 3. What does it mean that our old self was crucified with him, and what is the "body of sin" (Vs 6)?
- 4. How does this passage/sermon show that we have been brought into a whole new dominion under the reign of a whole New Master?
- 5. What does it mean that you are not under law but under grace? How does this encourage you (Vs 14)?
- 6. Consider this scenario and question: You have a Christian friend who is particularly discouraged by besetting sin in their life. How would you encourage that friend with the truth of Romans 6:1-14?
- 7. How does this passage show us the power for sanctification and personally give you real hope to put away sin and follow Christ this week?

#### Why Do That in Worship?

#### Confessions of Sin & Assurance of Pardon

Public confession of sin, while often neglected or even disdained in our own time, was an accepted element of worship in virtually every branch of Christendom from the early church through the end of the 19th century. But make no mistake, it is Biblical (read Nehemiah 9 and the Psalms).

As the American church increasingly emphasized relaxation and spectacle in worship, and particularly the "comfort" of non-believers, confession of sins in public worship was abandoned in favor of friendlier activities.

For us as a Reformed congregation, corporate confession of our sins is an important part of the dialogue between God and His people because the Bible clearly teaches that unconfessed sin disrupts our relationship with the Lord, and is a barrier to worship (Psalm 24:3-5, Psalm 32, II Chronicles 7:14). Once our sins are sincerely confessed, we are able to offer acceptable worship to our holy God.

Now, as we confess our sins before our God, what assurance do we have that God has heard our earnest confession and has indeed forgiven our sins? How do we hear God's part in the dialogue? We have the unfailing promises of God in His word that are "yea and amen" to us at Christ Community Church just as they were to His people of old (See 2 Corinthians 1:20).

We must never forget that forgiveness of sins comes only through the mediation of our risen Savior, and not through the pronouncements of any man (Acts 5:31, Ephesians 1:7-10).

For this reason, the Assurance of Pardon that appears (at times) in our Order of Worship is drawn directly from Scripture. When the Pastor pronounces the Assurance of Pardon, he is appropriating it for himself as well, a believer among fellow believers.

Before the throne of God above, I have a strong and perfect plea,
A great High Priest Whose name is Love, Whoever lives and pleads for me.
My name is graven on His hands; my name is written on His heart;
I know that while in heaven He stands no tongue can bid me thence depart.
When Satan tempts me to despair, and tells me of the guilt within,

Because the sinless Savior died, my sinful soul is counted free;
