Matthew 5:27-30.

- 1. Common first reaction: "Christianity condemns all sexual desire."
- 2. Preacher's thesis: Biblical view of sex is radically different from culture—yet profoundly attractive.

# II. The Integrity of Sex

- A. Biblical ethic in a single phrase: "Sex only inside a covenant."
- B. Defining *covenant* vs. consumer relationships
- 1. Consumer: "You adjust to me or I'm gone."

Covenant: "I adjust to you because the relationship outranks my needs."

- 2. Why mutual covenant matters
  - a. Creates a **zone of safety**—no marketing or performance masks.
  - b. Generates **richer feelings** that grow when commitment precedes emotion (analogy: parent—child).
  - c. Produces **freedom** (Kierkegaard): promises liberate us from slavery to feelings.
- 3. Sex as **covenant good / sacrament** 
  - d. Physical nakedness symbolizes whole-life self-gift.

- e. Sex outside marriage lacks integrity—"asking bodies to say what lives have withheld" (C. S. Lewis).
- 4. Consequences of breaking covenant design
  - f. Damages sex's "commitment-apparatus" (John White).
  - g. Empirical evidence: cohabitation & consumer habits raise divorce risk (NY Times article).

#### III. The Challenge of Lust

- A. Jesus deepens the command: lustful looking = heart-level adultery.
- B. Key term denotes **idolatrous greed**, not mere attraction.
- C. Parallels with monetary greed
  - 1. Self-seeking, addictive, fantasy-driven, God-replacing.
- D. Four contemporary forms of sexual idolatry
  - 2. Pornography & masturbation—sex as frictionless self-consumption.
  - 3. All sex outside marriage—consumer leverage to "keep the relationship."
  - 4. Cultural myth: "I can't be whole or happy without sex."
  - 5. Romantic fair-tale idolatry—perfect spouse/home/kids as ultimate fulfillment.
    - E. Jesus' drastic imagery (gouge eye, cut hand)
  - 6. Hyperbole urging radical measures to escape addiction.
  - 7. Modern data: pornography warps expectations, weakens marriage prospects, pressures women.

#### IV. The Future of Love

- A. Gehenna image—hell as unfulfilled, unquenchable longing.
  - Sex outside covenant foreshadows this emptiness: "water, water everywhere ..."
  - Sex inside covenant points forward—foretaste of eternal union with Christ.
- C. Jesus & the Samaritan woman (John 4)
  - Living-water promise exposes her serial search for fulfillment in men.
- D. Ultimate cure: Christ as "spouse of the soul."
  - A marriage (or singleness) thrives only when His love is primary.
  - Without that, even covenant marriage collapses into consumer demands.
  - Drink deeply of Christ's spousal love; only then will our sexuality point others to Him.
