Let's Study

Read Esther 1:1-8.

King Xerxes throws a six-month 'open-house' banquet to gain support for the next war. What do you make of all the architectural, fashion, and wine detail given here? What does that tell you about the king's wealth? Popularity? Ego?

Pastor Jon explained that in Persian culture at that time, the most important matters were discussed when the leaders were drunk because they believed that was when the supernatural came close. How does this impact your understanding of the situation?

Read Esther 1:9. Who did Queen Vashti throw a separate party for? What does this clarify about the culture?

Read Esther 1:10-12.

Queen Vashti refuses the king's order to come to the king's party because it would dishonor her. What possible consequences would she expect? What words would you use to describe Vashti's actions?

What reasons could the king have to be furious about this?

Read Esther 1:13-18. The king seeks counsel from his advisors. In your own words summarize their advice.

What important decision is pending for you? What input from the group would you appreciate?

Read Matthew 6:33.
