Let's Talk

Revelation 14 explicitly draws on a distinct dichotomy of good vs. evil: being under the rule of God or under the rule of Satan. This chapter highlights the significance and power of the Good News through Jesus' defeat of sin and death.

The message is that we can find so much hope and joy in the victory of Jesus over Satan. In what ways does this knowledge impact your day to day life?

Let's Study

1. Read Revelation 14:1,3b-5.

- Who are the 144,000?
- How are they described, and why do you think that is significant?
- Why do you think the 144,000 are the only ones who can hear the song? See if your group can support your explanation with Scripture.

2. Read Revelation 14:2.

- Identify the sounds that are described in this verse.
- How does this help you understand the magnificence of this scene?

3. Read Revelation 14:6-11. There are three angels and each proclaims a message. What are the messages of each angel?

4. Read Revelation 14:12-13.

- What is the meaning of the angels' messages?
- How does this resonate with you?

5. Read Revelation 15:1-4.

- Who stands on 'the glass sea mixed with fire'?
- Why is it significant that they stand over the sea?
- Why is it significant that they are singing and playing music?

Let's Apply

Read Revelation 14:12.

From this text, we address 3 key ideas:

1. Keeping your eye on the Lamb and root your identity in Him
2. Being patient and remaining faithful to Jesus' commands
3. Struggling and submitting

What are you currently struggling/battling with and how can your connect group support you in your journey? What truths might you need to be reminded of?

Pastor Jon mentioned at the end of the sermon this week that Christians “must accept the plain teaching of Scripture on Judgement and its implications.” Have you ever struggled with accepting this teaching? Do you notice a pattern in the ways you are challenged by these themes we have discovered in Revelation? Discuss with your group.

God, give us a sense of urgency of what you said in your word regarding our salvation. Reveal people/areas of our circle we may need to begin or continue praying for. Let us be reminded of our victory in you. Thank you, God. In the name of your Holy Son, Jesus, Amen.
