Jesus Calls You to Repentance

- "Unless you repent, you will all likewise perish" By this warning, the Lord would turn us away from wickedness and bring us to life in Himself. For He is patient with us, that we would not be cut down in our sin but live and bear fruit in Him. (Luke 13:3, 5).
- As He lives, the Lord has "no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but that the wicked turn from his way and live." (Ezek. 33:11).
- So the Scriptures have been "written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come, that we should not desire evil but trust in Christ. He alone is faithful, the Rock who feeds us with His "spiritual food" and pours out His "spiritual drink." Cor. 10:3–4).

20 March 2022. Repentance for All. Luke 13:1-5.

Jesus replied to them, "Do you think that this happened to them because they were more sinful than other people from Galilee? No! I can guarantee that they weren't. But if you don't turn to God and change the way you think and act, then you, too, will all die.

Contrary to what natural religion and human reason might conclude, Jesus makes it abundantly clear that no person can deny or escape the universal need of turning to God and changing the way we think and act.

- 1. Natural religion and human reason judge by outward appearances
 - a. Natural religion sees only cause and effect
 - b. Human reason demands that catastrophe = crime
- 2. God warns against making comparisons
 - a. Do you think they were more sinful?
 - b. Grant me to see my own errors and not judge my neighbor
- 3. God offers everyone the opportunity to turn to Him and live
 - a. Unless you all turn to God, then you too will all die
 - b. "I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked."
