<u>SELECTED READINGS. 5TH SUNDAY IN LENT. 3 APRIL 2022</u> Old Testament/Isaiah 43:16–21. Epistle/Phil.3:(4–14. Gospel/Luke 20:9–20

God's Beloved Son Has Redeemed Us.

- Our life and works apart from Christ, no matter how they may glitter to the eyes of the world, are ultimately rubbish and have no righteousness. Rather, in the scandalous cross of Jesus, we find our righteousness alone "through faith in Christ". By such faith, we "know him and the power of his resurrection." (Phil. 3:10)
- For the same God who brought Israel out of Egypt has done a "new thing" for us in Christ Jesus. He has sent His beloved Son into His vineyard to be killed by sinful men and to become "the stone that the builders rejected." Yet, the One rejected by men "has become the cornerstone" of His Church. (Luke 20)
- Through the waters of Holy Baptism, He provides us daily refreshment in our earthly pilgrimage, "a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Is. 43:19)

3 April 2022. I will send them My Son. Luke 20:13.

"What shall I do now?

I will send them My Son who is so dear to me, Perhaps they will respect him." In sending His own dear Son, God not only fulfills His plan of salvation, but offers deliverance to those who receive Him and damnation to those who reject His undeserved kindness.

- 1. Sending the Son who is so dear to Him completes God's plan
 - a. Jesus is the stone rejected by the builders
 - b. Jesus becomes the cornerstone
- 2. To those who receive His dear Son, God offers deliverance
 - a. We fall on the stone/Jesus and are broken as we turn to God and change the way
 - we think and act.
 - b. Now we are raised as living stones in the God's temple
- 3. To those who reject His dear Son, God promises damnation
 - a. The Message: "he'll be smashed to smithereens!"
 - b. They feared the people, they sent spies to catch Him
