#### **READINGS**

## Old Testament/Isaiah 44:6–8 Epistle/Romans 8:18–27 Gospel/Matthew 13:24–43 The Word of the Gospel Bestows the Righteousness of Christ and Brings Forth Faith

- The good Seed, which is "the Son of Man," Jesus Himself (Matt. 13:37), brings forth a harvest of faith and bears good fruits in "the sons of the kingdom" (Matt. 13:38). Whatever is sown apart from His Word is of the devil, who plants the weeds of unbelief and sin, even among the people of God. Thankfully, the Lord is patient and He does not uproot the weeds, lest the plants also be destroyed. He lets "both grow together until the harvest" (Matt. 13:30), while He continues to preach repentance and forgiveness of sins.
- Thus, He preserves His Church in righteousness, because He alone is "the King of Israel and his Redeemer" (Is. 44:6). Since all things are in His gracious care and keeping, "fear not, nor be afraid" (Is. 44:8).
- For "the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God" (Rom. 8:19), and in this hope we also wait with patience. Though we do not yet see it, "the Spirit helps us in our weakness" (Rom. 8:26) and, in truth, "the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us" (Rom. 8:18).

#### STEWARDSHIP

# Rom. 8:18 – "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us."

It is very easy to get caught up in the present and lose track of our ultimate destiny in the Kingdom of God. St. Paul encourages us to keep eternity in mind.

This certainly has an application to our support for the Gospel.

If we keep our focus on "the glory to be revealed," we will see our tithes and offerings in a new light.

## + Seventh Sunday after Pentecost + 19 July 2020

Maddening Mixture of Good Seed and Weeds: Matthew 13:37-39

He replied, "The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man; the field is the world; and the good seed—these are the children of the kingdom.

The weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sowed them is the devil.

The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels.

Since the end of the age is not yet upon us – of that day there will be no doubt – we live, work and pray as those who believe that God can take even children of the evil one and make of them children of His good and gracious Kingdom.

#### 1. Two kinds of people are being planted in this world

- a. Children of the Kingdom
- b. Children of the evil one

#### 2. How we live in this world has an impact for good or ill

- a. Frightening possibility of being pulled to the dark side: Saruman, Darth Vader et al.
- b. Joyful possibility of coming to the light: C.S. Lewis "On Living in an Atomic Age."

#### 3. There is coming a Day of reckoning and ultimate accountability

- a. Weeds will be separated by holy angels
- b. Wheat will be gathered into the Father's barn

### Discipleship Leading to Evangelism

<u>The Liturgy of Life</u> – "When Sunday Worship comes to an end, … <u>the liturgy of the Church</u> goes into the world with us… through each unique vocation. We are Christ's people, standing in the midst of a broken world. As the Baptized Children of God, we bear witness in our words and lives to the Christ who dwells in us. Our lives testify that Christ's presence in the world transforms the culture and makes it new. To live in Christ is to bear witness that Jesus Christ is present in our world in His gifts. Christ is present in the world through us…. and He is present for the life of the world.

Many people today want to know how to be a Christian. What they are really asking is how to live like Christ. The response: 'Be like Christ who lives in you!' But they will ask: 'What does this mean?' The answer comes from Jesus' Sermon on the Plain (Luke 6):

'Love your enemies, be merciful, compassionate, forgive, and do works of charity.'

But they will ask: 'How is this done?' The answer:

- 'Come to church and receive the gifts of Christ's in hearing the Law and the Gospel preached and sung in the liturgy... in feasting at His banquet in Holy Communion.
- Remember your Baptism; repent of your sins and be forgiven and reborn ... ready to serve your God and ready to serve your neighbors and your family...who you can now love.
- And then go out .... as the Baptized Children of God. Go out into the world and be what you have become in Christ.'

This is life in Christ. This is how we continue to tell the world its story about real life in Christ through our lives. <u>This is the liturgy of life!"</u>
