

Readings

Old Testament/Isaiah 55:1–5. Epistle/Romans 9:1–13. Gospel/Matthew 14:13–21 Christ Jesus, the Living Bread from Heaven, Feeds the Children of God

- By the Gospel of "the Christ, who is God over all, blessed forever" (Rom. 9:5), we are "the children of God" (Rom. 9:8), "not because of works but because of him who calls" (Rom. 9:11). Therefore, "listen diligently" and "hear, that your soul may live."
- By His sacrificial death in His flesh and blood, He has made "an everlasting covenant" for us. Since He now calls us to Himself, we come to Him "and eat what is good, and delight ... in rich food" (Is. 55:2–3). He has come with divine compassion to save us from sin and death and to feed us with Himself.
- As our Lord Jesus once took bread, "said a blessing," broke the loaves "and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds" (Matt. 14:18–19), He also now takes bread, blesses it by His Word to be His very body, and distributes it to His Church by the hand of His called and ordained servants. Just as "they took up twelve baskets full of the broken pieces," there is more than enough for His whole Church to eat and to be satisfied (Matt. 14:20).

Stewardship

Matt. 14:17-18 – "They said to him, 'We have only five loaves here and two fish.' And he said, 'Bring them here to me.'"

When the disciples held on to the five loaves and two fish, that's exactly what they had. But when they handed them over to the Lord, the multitudes were fed. Apart from Jesus all we do and all we have is nothing. But, in Jesus, all we do and have is blessed to be used by the Lord for His gracious work.

From One Man: A Christian response to Racism Acts 17:24-28

The God who made the world and everything in it, being Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in temples made by man, nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mankind life and breath and everything. And he made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined allotted periods and the boundaries of their dwelling place, that they should seek God, and perhaps feel their way toward him and find him. Yet he is actually not far from each one of us,. for "In him we live and move and have our being"; as even some of your own poets have said, "For we are indeed his offspring."

When we remember that God not only created us, but provides everything we need and desires us to live as His offspring in a relationship of love and gratitude with Him and each other, we will have found the only effective response to the racism that threatens to tear us apart.

- 1. God is the Maker of heaven and earth
 - a. He made the world and everything in it. He owns it
 - b. He gives mankind life and breath and everything
- 2. From one man He made every nation
 - a. He scattered us and created diversity of language and tribe
 - b. He determines allotted times and boundaries of our dwelling
- 3. He desires all mankind to live in a relationship of love
 - a. He is not far: in Him we live and move and have our being
 - b. We are indeed His offspring -- in Jesus, crucified and risen
- "... because he has fixed a day on which he will judge the world in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed; and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead."
