Old Testament/Deut.30:15–20. Epistle/1 Corin.3:1–9, Gospel/ Matthew 5:21–37 Christ Sets Life Before Us so that We Can Walk in His Ways

- The God who reveals Himself in His incarnate Son promises life and blessing to all
 who obey His commandments "by loving the LORD your God, by walking in his ways,
 and by keeping his commandments and his statutes and his rules." (Deut. 30:16)
- However, we are "people of the flesh" and "infants in Christ", among whom "there is jealousy and strife". (1 Cor. 3:3)
- Jesus must instruct us against the human ways of anger, adultery, divorce and false witness because all who live in these ways "shall surely perish". On the cross, He died to forgive our sins and free us from the ways of curse and death. Since Jesus Christ is our "life and length of days" we can be reconciled to our brother, live in chastity and marital faithfulness, and speak with honesty. He who serves from His cross also offers His gift of reconciliation at His altar, and we can be at peace with our brothers and sisters in Christ who are "God's field, God's building." (Matt. 5:21–37)

Sermon Notes <u>Treating the Root Cause</u> Matthew 5:23-24

Mercies that are new every morning, along with peace, and love are multiplied to you from God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit!

"So if you are offering your gift at the altar and remember there that another believer has something against you, leave your gift at the altar. First go away and make peace with that person. Then come back and offer your gift.

Unlike most modern pharmaceutical medicines that only treat or cover up symptoms of disease, Jesus offers true healing, redemption, and reconciliation by treating the root cause of sin in His perfect sacrifice on the Cross.

- 1. We live in a world that ignores root causes at all costs
 - 1. Most proposed solutions are satisfied with treating symptoms
 - 2. Our great temptation to turn Good News into Law
- 2. We live in a Kingdom of grace that gets to the root cause of sin
 - 1. Jesus destroys the power of sin and death
 - 2. Jesus demolishes the works of the evil one
- 3. We live in a Church made holy by mutual love and forgiveness
 - 1. The absolute necessity of forgiveness
 - 2. A foretaste of the Feast to come
