Scriptures on change:

- 1) *Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. (Hebrews 13:8)*
- 2) *And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who¹⁰ have been called according to his purpose. (Romans 8:28)*
- 3) *For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. (Jeremiah 29:11)*
- 4) *We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure. (Hebrews 6:19)*
- 5) *May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. (Romans 15:13)*
