1. Master

2. Mission



- <u>The great commission</u>... "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations" (Matt. 28:19-20)
- 1 Corinthians 10:31, "whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God."
- Matthew 5:13-16 calls us to be <u>salt and light</u> to the world... shining a light that others see our <u>good works</u> and <u>give glory to our</u> <u>father</u>.
- Ephesians 2:10... we are his workmanship created in Christ Jesus for <u>good works</u> which God prepared beforehand to <u>walk in them</u>.
- Matthew 6:33... we are to seek first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness.
- Mark 12:30-31... love the Lord our God with all our heart and soul and mind and strength, and love our neighbor as ourselves.
- In Romans 12 we are called to present our bodies as a <u>living sacrifice holy and acceptable to God, not be conformed to the worl, but</u> <u>be transformed by the renewing of our mind.</u>
- Jesus said in John 8:12, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of life."
- Revelation 4:11... "<u>Worthy are You</u>, our Lord and our God, to <u>receive glory and honor and power</u>, for You <u>created all things</u>, and because of Your will they existed, and were created."

2. Mission

- <u>True joy</u> can only be found in following your lord and savior Jesus Christ, not in following your crush.
- <u>True peace</u> can only be found in seeking first His kingdom and His righteousness, not in seeking someone else.
- <u>True security</u> can only be found by loving God with your heart, soul, mind, and strength and being filled with God's love for you, not in loving or being loved by him or her.
- <u>True faithfulness</u> can only be found by presenting your life as a living sacrifice to God, not by presenting yourself as the best looking girl or guy.
- <u>True fulfillment</u> can only be found in service to Christ and His church and by being salt and light to an unbelieving world, not by meeting the girl or guy of your dreams.

The "Means" of Ephesians 5


The wife (or prospective wife) should be living a life of submission, as a loving, encouraging helper who is content/thankful with the MEANS!

The husband (or prospective husband) should be sacrificially loving and leading and working to provide the MEANS of living for the wife. Ephesians 5:2 "and walk in love, just as Christ also loved us and gave Himself up for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God.

John 15:12 "This is My commandment, that you love one another, just as I have loved you. 13 Greater love has no one than this, that one lay down his life for his friends."

1 John 3:16 "By this we have known love, that He laid down His life for us; and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers."

5. Sexual maturity sufficient to marry and fulfill God's purposes.

6. Moral maturity sufficient to lead as an example of righteousness.

7. Ethical maturity sufficient to make responsible decisions.

8. Worldview maturity sufficient to understand what is really important.

9. Relational maturity sufficient to understand and respect other.

10. Social maturity sufficient to make a contribution to society.

11. Verbal maturity sufficient to communicate and articulate as a man.

12. Character maturity sufficient to demonstrate courage under fire.

13. Biblical maturity sufficient to lead at some level in the church.

5. Mutual Affection

- *"Strong feelings of passion do not matter if the first four qualities are not present in your lives."*
- Feelings of affection are important, but not biblically essential.

Advice if you don't have feelings:

- *"Right feelings are produced in the laboratory of responsibility and duty, to one another and before God."*
- Spend time away from each other and evaluate. Growing fonder or wander?
- *Cultivate the friendship aspect.* Do things that you can enjoy together.
- Be patient and slow the relationship down, you may be able to cultivate feelings or it may become clear that it is best not to pursue marriage.

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
