HOW TO KNOW IF YOU HAVE GODLY WISDOM, PART 2 James 3:13-18

¹³Who among you is wise and understanding? Let him show by his good behavior his deeds in the gentleness of wisdom. ¹⁴But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your heart, do not be arrogant and so lie against the truth. ¹⁵This wisdom is not that which comes down from above, but is earthly, natural, demonic. ¹⁶For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there is disorder and every evil thing. ¹⁷But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, reasonable, full of mercy and good fruits, unwavering, without hypocrisy. ¹⁸And the seed whose fruit is righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace.

	The importance and value of godly wisdom is emphasized in the both the OT (in the 5 books of Wisdom Literature—Job, Ps., Pr., Ec., and SS) and in the NT (Lu. 2:52; Ac. 6:3, 10; Ro. 16:19; Co. 1:28; 4:5; Ep. 5:15)

•	Three basic elements of biblical wisdom:
	(1) God Proverbs 1:7 - The fear of the Lord is <u>beginning of knowledge</u> ; fools despise wisdom
	(2) Understanding God's Psalm 107:43 - Who is wise? Let him give heed to these things, and consider the lovingkindnesses of the Lord.
	 (3) Having the practical skill to apply God's ways and God's Word to Psalm 111:10 - The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom; a good understanding have all those who do His commandments. Proverbs 8:13 - The fear of the LORD is to hate evil; pride and arrogance and the evil way and the perverted mouth, I hate.

 - Robert Johnstone "We have here again what may be described as the central thought of this epistle, that where religion has [a] real saving hold of a mind and heart, it cannot from its nature but powerfully influence the outward life."
 - o In other words, if we have really been changed on the inside, then it's going to express itself in how we act. And so, the more wisdom we have, the more it will be reflected in in every area of our life.

It recognizes how unable we are in and of ourselves to chart our own course in the world. This virtue flows out of the conviction that God is sovereign over everything that happens in life and that He is at the same time both wise and good." o Psalm 131 - O LORD, my heart is not proud, nor my eyes haughty; Nor do I involve myself in great matters, nor in things too difficult for me. - o Colossians 3:12 So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, of kindness, humility, <u>gentleness</u> and patience; bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you.
- <u>Titus 3:1-2</u> Remind them to be subject to rulers, to authorities, to be obedient, to be ready for every good deed, to malign no one, to be peaceable, <u>gentle</u>, showing every consideration for all men.
- If we have genuine wisdom, (if we truly fear God, understand His ways, and trying to apply His Word to our life), then we will be characterized by gentleness:
 - o a submission to the will and purpose of God
 - o a humble gentleness toward others
- <u>Galatians 5:22-23</u> The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, <u>gentleness</u>, self-control.

- 1 Corinthians 3:19 For the wisdom of this world is foolishness before God.
- Romans 12:2 Do not be conformed to this world

The worldly wisdom of our day (Al Mohler in "Preaching the Cross"):

- **Self-fulfillment:** A culture that prioritizes personal satisfaction and happiness, evident in the popularity of self-help resources.
- **Self-sufficiency:** Emphasis on individual independence and achievement, sometimes to the point of neglecting reliance on God or others.
- **Self-definition:** The idea that individuals can determine their own identity and meaning, including aspects like gender and humanity.
- **Self-absorption:** A focus on oneself, leading to isolation and prioritizing personal needs over relationships and community.
- **Self-transcendence:** Individuals crafting their own spirituality by picking and choosing elements from different religions, believing they can define and dictate their own spiritual reality.
- **Self-enhancement:** The idea that individuals can improve themselves beyond what they were created to be, exemplified by cosmetic procedures and advancements in technology.
- **Self-security:** A sense of confidence in one's own safety and well-being, often leading to a lack of awareness of potential dangers or the need for a higher power.
