

I. God's power and promise brought into question (Exodus 5:1-23)

- Pharaoh denies God's power (v1-14)**
- Pharaoh's persecution leads Israel to doubt God's power (v15-21)**
- Moses doubts God's power and promise to save his people (v22-23)**

II. God reminds Moses and Israel of his power and promise amidst doubt (Exodus 6:1-30)

- God reminds Moses of his power and promise (v2-5)**
- God reminds Israel of his power and promise (v6-8)**
- Hardship and unworthiness lead Israel and Moses to doubt God**
- God is faithful to his promise from generation to generation**

III. Moses finally trusts in the power and promise of God (Exodus 7:1-13)

- Moses, like God before Pharaoh (v1-3)**
- Moses goes before Pharaoh, trusting in God's promise (v4-13)**

**Application: Because God is faithful,
trust in the power and promise of God.**

- **God's power enables him to keep his promises.**
- **God's promises are found in scripture alone.**
- **Jesus is the embodiment of God's power and promise.**
- **Trusting in God's power and promise isn't easy, but there is grace.**
