

Highlights of the Psalm

 God's Word is emphasized all the way through

⁹⁷ Oh how I love your law! It is my meditation all the day. ⁹⁸ Your commandment makes me wiser than my enemies, for it is ever with me. ⁹⁹ I have more understanding than all my teachers, for your testimonies are my meditation. ¹⁰⁰ I understand more than the aged, for I keep your precepts. ¹⁰¹ I hold back my feet from every evil way, in order to keep your word. ¹⁰² I do not turn aside from your rules, for you have taught me. ¹⁰³ How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth! ¹⁰⁴ Through your precepts I get understanding; therefore I hate every false way.

These 8 words for God's Word are repeatedly used - Every section uses 5 of these words

- Each 'word' is used 20+ times in this Psalm

These 8 words for God's Word repeatedly used:

- IF Ps 119 was written by David to Solomon,
- "The Word" here was very limited.
- It ONLY included Torah, Joshua & Judges, Job, maybe 1 Samuel.
- ALL the rest of the Old Testament came later!

This is <u>quite different</u> than what we have for God's Word, and what we imagine

 - All a One-way conversation !
 - No asides, explanations, or response
 - It's PERSONAL

The Voice: Who's talking?

Many want to know "What does GOD say?", Not "What does this random guy say?"

Q: Does 'stream of consciousness' belong in the Bible?!?



There are NO DETAILS in this text!

 Struggles, conflicts, sickness... NONE of them get specific, ALL are totally generic.

• Why is that? Is that helpful?



So why is this Psalm in the Bible ?

Not for God's comments
Not for INFO, facts
A model to follow?



Why this Psalm may be in the Bible -

Compare:

"I believe in God the Father almighty, maker of Heaven and Earth"

And

"You are my father. You established the earth. I and all things are your servants."



A concern in our culture:

Much of our education is about rationality & knowing; and often without using.

Does "discipleship" become more about KNOWLEDGE or CHARACTER ?



Why this Psalm may be in the Bible -

Romans 12:2 "Do not be conformed to the world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind..."

How is this transformation done? Does Psalm 119 give us any insights or pattern?



Why this Psalm may be in the Bible -

"We become what we think about. Our thoughts shape who we become."



My encouragement to you:

 Read the Bible. NOT so God is happy with us, but so we can be changed

- My goal: THINK Scripture, don't just think ABOUT Scripture
