Exodus 34:1 The Lord said to Moses,
"Cut for yourself two tablets of stone like
the first, and I will write on the tablets the
words that were on the first tablets, which
you broke. **2** Be ready by the morning, and
come up in the morning to Mount Sinai,
and present yourself there to me on the
top of the mountain. **3** No one shall come
up with you, and let no one be seen

Exodus 34:3 ... throughout all the mountain. Let no flocks or herds graze opposite that mountain." 4 So Moses cut two tablets of stone like the first. And he rose early in the morning and went up on Mount Sinai, as the Lord had commanded him, and took in his hand two tablets of stone. 5 The Lord descended in the cloud and stood with him there, and proclaimed

Exodus 34:5 ... the name of the Lord.

Exodus 34:11 ... will drive out before you the Amorites, the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites. **12** Take care, lest you make a covenant with the inhabitants of the land to which you go, lest it become a snare in your midst. **13** You shall tear down their altars and break their pillars and cut down their Asherim **14** (for you shall worship no

Exodus 34:14 ... other god, for the Lord,
whose name is Jealous, is a jealous God),
15 lest you make a covenant with the
inhabitants of the land, and when they
whore after their gods and sacrifice to their
gods and you are invited, you eat of his
sacrifice, **16** and you take of their
daughters for your sons, and their
daughters whore after their gods and

Exodus 34:16 ... make your sons whore after their gods. **17** "You shall not make for yourself any gods of cast metal. **18** "You shall keep the Feast of Unleavened Bread. Seven days you shall eat unleavened bread, as I commanded you, at the time appointed in the month Abib, for in the month Abib you came out from Egypt. **19** All that open the womb are mine, all

Exodus 34:19 ... your male livestock, the firstborn of cow and sheep. **20** The firstborn of a donkey you shall redeem with a lamb, or if you will not redeem it you shall break its neck. All the firstborn of your sons you shall redeem. And none shall appear before me empty-handed. **21** "Six days you shall work, but on the seventh day you shall rest. In plowing time

Exodus 34:21 ... and in harvest you shall rest. **22** You shall observe the Feast of Weeks, the firstfruits of wheat harvest, and the Feast of Ingathering at the year's end. **23** Three times in the year shall all your males appear before the Lord God, the God of Israel. **24** For I will cast out nations before you and enlarge your borders; no one shall covet your land, when you go up

Exodus 34:24 ... to appear before the Lord your God three times in the year.

25 "You shall not offer the blood of my sacrifice with anything leavened, or let the sacrifice of the Feast of the Passover remain until the morning. **26** The best of the firstfruits of your ground you shall bring to the house of the Lord your God. You shall not boil a young goat in its mother's

Exodus 34:26 ... milk." 27 And the Lord said to Moses, "Write these words, for in accordance with these words I have made a covenant with you and with Israel."
28 So he was there with the Lord forty days and forty nights. He neither ate bread nor drank water. And he wrote on the tablets the words of the covenant, the Ten Commandments.
