1 Good Money

22 The blessing of the LORD makes rich, and he adds no sorrow with it.

1 Good Money

God didn't give creation to the first humans to own, but to steward.

To steward means to manage or look after someone else's property.

The wise steward believes:

- wisdom is more important than wealth (Proverbs 3:13)
- a good reputation is more important than wealth (Proverbs 22:1-2)
- humility is essential for a rich life (Proverbs 22:4)
- pursuing justice for the oppressed is essential for a rich life (Proverbs 29:7)

The wise steward:

- works hard (Proverbs 12:11, 12:27, 13:4)
- patiently plans (Proverbs 13:11, 21:5-6)
- blesses future generations (Proverbs 13:22-23)
- is generous to God's work and to the needy (Proverbs 3:9-10, 19:17)

God created wealth and money as a good thing for us to steward for His glory and the good of others.

2 Bad Money

Foolish owners are prone to:

- Dishonesty (Proverbs 21:6)
- Injustice (Proverbs 22:16, 22:22)
- Burnout (Proverbs 23:4)
- Being Stingy (Proverbs 11:24)
- Pride (Proverbs 18:11-12)
- Overconsumption (Proverbs 21:17)
- Laziness (Proverbs 21:26, 13:4)
- Hopelessness (Proverbs 11:4, 11:7)
- Comparison & Coveting (Proverbs 11:11-12)
- Impatience (Proverbs 21:5)

The one who is trying to own wealth actually loses it.

The one who simply stewards wealth, gains it.
