1 The Context

Who wrote the book of Matthew?

Matthew; former tax collector & eye witness disciple

Who was the book written to?

Jewish christians and skeptics in the 1st century

Why was this book written?

To show Jesus is the real King bringing God's Kingdom

1 The Context

Matthew 1:1-2

1 The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham. **2** Abraham was the father of Isaac, and Isaac the father of Jacob, and Jacob the father of Judah and his brothers...

1 The Context

Matthew 1:16-17

...and Jacob the father of Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom Jesus was born, who is called Christ. **17** So all the generations from Abraham to David were fourteen generations, and from David to the deportation to Babylon fourteen generations, and from the deportation to Babylon to the Christ fourteen generations.

Matthew 21:1

1 Now when they drew near to Jerusalem... Setting: Passover week **Passover:** The Jewish holiday remembering their rescue from Egypt and anticipating God's future Messiah King and future Kingdom

Matthew 21:2

2 saying to them, "Go into the village in front of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them to me.



Matthew 21:3

3 If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once."

Matthew 21:4-5

4 This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying,"

5 "Say to the daughter of Zion,'Behold, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden."

Zechariah 9:9

Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is he, Jesus is saying *"lawful or legitimate"* "I am the REAL KING"

Matthew 21:10

10 And when he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred up, saying, "Who is this?"

Jesus rode into Jerusalem, not as a lion king coming to overthrow the Romans, but as a lamb King coming to be sacrificed for our sin.

Ephesians 2:1-2

1 And you were dead in the trespasses and sins
2 in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air...

Ephesians 2:4-5

4 But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, **5** even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ – by grace you have been saved –

Ephesians 2:6-7

6 and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, **7** so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.

Matthew 11:28-30

28 Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. **29** Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. **30** For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.
