2 Samuel 12:13, 14 - Then David confessed to Nathan, "I've sinned against God." Nathan pronounced, "Yes, but that's not the last word. God forgives your sin. You won't die for it. But because of your blasphemous behavior, the son born to you will die."

• From David's sin we see that our sin doesn't just affect us but the lives of everyone we love. David's sin caused God's name and reputation to be blasphemed. His sin made our God good look bad. Follow your heart?!? Don't you dare? It will deceive you! This is War!!

David didn't deny his sin or shift the blame he confessed. The truth brought to him by the Prophet Nathan was used by God to bring David to repentance. David wrote Psalms 51 after Nathan came to him and he confessed his sin. Psalm 51 helps us to see what repentance looks like when truth overcomes the deception of our heart and we put on the righteousness of Christ receiving forgiveness by His grace and restoration to serve Him.
