# A. What True Friendship is and is not!

#### 1. A True Friend Is Loyal, Not Casual

(Proverbs 17:17): "A friend loves at all times, And a brother is born for adversity."

### Two Teachings

a. A True Friend is Always a Friend

Psalm 15 asks the question "Who can live on God's Holy Mountain?" One of those criteria is a man who keeps his word <u>even when it costs him</u> <u>something</u>. *A True Friend Loves at ALL Times*.

a' Contrast the Casual Friend from Proverbs 19:6-7: "Many seek favors from a ruler; everyone is the friend of a person who gives gifts! The relatives of the poor despise them; how much more their friends avoid them! Though the poor plead with them, their friends are gone."

b. A brother is born for adversity.

b'. The Casual friend is one who will not remain for the hard times
