Chronological Order of Ezra

Cyrus' reign (Chapters 1-3)

- Zerubbabel brings the 1st wave of returnees to Jerusalem
- They set up the altar, begin worship
- They begin laying the foundation for the Temple
- The adversaries trouble them throughout the reigns of Cyrus and Darius (4:5)
- At some point work on the foundation stops until the 2nd year of Darius (4:24)

Darius's reign (Chapter 5-6)

- 2nd year of Darius (Chapter 5)
 - Haggai and Zechariah prophesy
 - Work on the foundation resumes
 - The foundation is laid in the 9th month
 - Work on the Temple structure begins
- 4th year of Darius
 - Zechariah's final prophecies of the coming King and Kingdom
- 6th year of Darius (Chapter 6)
 - o The Temple is completed
 - Work on the city begins (assumed, since there is a decree issued by Artaxerxes to stop work on the city. Not much progress is made, as Nehemiah finds the gates and walls still in ruin)

Artaxerxes' reign (Chapter 7-10)

- Early in his reign (Chapter 4)**
 - 1st letter sent by Bishlam, Mithredath, and Tabel
 - o 2nd letter sent by Rehum and Shimshai
 - o <u>Artaxerxes' decree</u> stops work on the city
- 7th year of Artaxerxes
 - Artaxerxes decrees that Ezra is to take the 2nd wave of returnees to Jerusalem & teach the people the Law (Chapter 7-8)
 - Ezra begins sanctifying God's people (Chapter 9-10)
- 20th year of Artaxerxes
 - Artaxerxes decrees that Nehemiah is to rebuild the city (Book of Nehemiah)
 - o The city wall is completed in 52 days
 - Grand celebration

Letter from Tattenai and Shethar-Boznai (they report that work on the Temple is progressing but not finished). Darius' decree – let it be built

**Artaxerxes issues three decrees:

- 1. Stop work in the city (Chapter 4)
- 2. Send Ezra to teach the people the Law (Chap 7-10)
- 3. Send Nehemiah to build the city (Nehemiah)

We do not know when Artaxerxes made the decree to stop work on the city. We know the Persian official had made him afraid that the city would be a rebellious city and revolt against him.

It seems natural that he would cause work on the city to stop, and then send Ezra to teach the people to be lawabiding citizens. That is the focus of Ezra's work in chapters 7-10 – to teach the people the Law.

Whether the decree to stop building the city comes before or during Ezra's commission to Jerusalem, the effect is to bring work on the physical House of God to a stop so that work on the spiritual House of God – the people – gets full attention.
