
WISDOM ON A LEASH: THE WAR FOR SELF-CONTROL

An Inventory of Cravings

<u>Uncontrolled lust</u>: Proverbs 11:6: "The righteousness of the upright delivers them, but the treacherous are taken captive by their lust."

<u>Uncontrolled drinking or substance abuse</u>: Proverbs 23:29-30: "Who has woe? Who has sorrow? Who has strife? Who has complaints? Who has needless bruises? Who has bloodshot eyes? ³⁰ Those who linger over wine, who go to sample bowls of mixed wine...in the end it bites like a snake and poisons like a viper."

<u>Uncontrolled anger</u>: Proverbs 14:29 (NIV): "Whoever is patient has great understanding, but one who is quick-tempered displays folly."

<u>Uncontrolled eating</u>: Proverbs 25:16:"If you have found honey, eat only enough for you, lest you have your fill of it and vomit it."

<u>Uncontrolled mouth</u>: Proverbs 18:6:The lips of fools bring them strife, and their mouths invite a beating

What would you say is a biblical definition of virtue?

A life of virtue is an unending war with evil inclinations that arise from within ourselves and are pounded at us by the Evil One

There is a subtle chemistry in each of us that corrupts grace into self-sufficiency


We enjoy His goodness and then we twist it into self assured Summarizing:

3. The Solution For it:

Prov. 4:4-9: When I was a son with my father, tender and precious to my mother, ⁴ he taught me and said, "Your heart must hold on to my words. Keep my commands and live. ⁵ <u>Get wisdom, get understanding</u>; don't forget or turn away from the words from my mouth. ⁶ Don't abandon wisdom, and she will watch over you; love her, and she will guard you. ⁷ <u>Wisdom is supreme—so get wisdom</u>. And whatever else you get, <u>get understanding</u>. ⁸ Cherish her, and she will exalt you; if you embrace her, she will honor you. ⁹ She will place a garland of favor on your head; she will give you a crown of beauty."

PROVERBS 9:10

The fear of the LORD is the <u>beginning of wisdom</u>, and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight

FEAR OF THE LORD

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The Fear of the Lord will bring us to repentance and dependence

Proverbs 3:1-2, "My son, do not forget my teaching, but let your heart keep my commandments"

What does it mean to "not forget" God's teaching, and how can we ensure we remember every day?

Proverbs 3:5-6, "Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not rely on your own understanding. In all your ways KNOW Him and He will make your paths straight" (CSB)
