LET'S READ IT: HOSEA 2:14-23

¹⁴ "Therefore, behold, I am going to persuade her, Bring her *into* the wilderness,

And speak kindly to her.

¹⁵ Then I will give her her vineyards from there,

And the Valley of Achor as a door of hope.

And she will respond there as in the days of her youth,

As in the day when she went up from the land of Egypt.

¹⁶ And it will come about on that day," declares the LORD,

"That you will call Me my husband

And no longer call Me my Baal.

¹⁷ For I will remove the names of the Baals from her mouth, So that they will no longer be mentioned by their names.



LET'S READ IT: HOSEA 2:14-23

¹⁸On that day I will also make a covenant for them

With the animals of the field,

The birds of the sky,

And the crawling things of the ground.

And I will eliminate the bow, the sword, and war from the land,

And will let them lie down in safety.

¹⁹ I will betroth you to Me forever;

Yes, I will betroth you to Me in righteousness and in justice,

In favor and in compassion,

²⁰ And I will betroth you to Me in faithfulness.

Then you will know the LORD.



LET'S READ IT: HOSEA 2:14-23

²¹ "And it will come about on that day that I will respond," declares the LORD.

"I will respond to the heavens, and they will respond to the earth, ²² And the earth will respond to the grain, to the new wine, and to the oil,

And they will respond to Jezreel.

²³ I will sow her for Myself in the land.

I will also have compassion on her who had not obtained compassion,

And I will say to those who were not My people,

'You are My people!'

And they will say, 'You are my God!'"
