Oscar Wilde, speaking for all men at times, once said, "I can resist anything but temptation"

"You probably don't know the full strength of temptation"

C.S. Lewis wrote: "Only those who try to resist temptation know how strong it is... A man who gives in to temptation after five minutes simply does not know what it would have been like an hour later...We never find out the strength of the evil impulse inside us until we try to fight it: and Christ because He was the only man who never yielded to temptation is the only man who knows to the full what temptation means..."

We'll define temptation as an enticement to evil filled with false promises, subtle deceit, and outright lies originating from the world, the flesh, or the Devil

Temptation is a matter of the mind/heart long before it is ever an issue of behavior"

"Don't be conformed to this world but to be transformed by the renewal of your mind (Romans 12:1-2)

"Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it" (Prov. 4:23 NIV)

I. WISDOM SPEAKS BE WARNED AND BE ARMED (PROVERBS 6:20-24; 7:1-5)

Proverbs 6:20-24:

²⁰ My son, keep your father's commandment, and forsake not your mother's teaching. ²¹Bind them on your heart always; tie them around your neck. ²²When you walk, they will lead you; when you lie down, they will watch over you; and when you awake, they will talk with you. ²³For the commandment is a lamp and the teaching a light, and the reproofs of discipline are the way of life, ²⁴to preserve you from the evil woman, from the smooth tongue of the adulteress.

Proverbs 7: 1-5

¹My son, keep my words and treasure up my commandments with you; 2keep my commandments and live; keep my teaching as the apple of your eye; 3bind them on your fingers; write them on the tablet of your heart. ⁴Say to wisdom, "You are my sister," and call insight your intimate friend, 5 to keep you from the forbidden woman, from the adulteress with her smooth words

THE MAIN POINT

Temptation is unavoidable, so be ready to meet the challenge!

Though it is not the only weapon, God's Word is the powerful one Jesus used against the Evil One

II. TEMPTATION REARS ITS UGLY HEAD

a) Looking for Love in all the WRONG PLACES (7:6-9)

(Wisdom narrates) ⁶ For at the window of my house, I have looked out through my lattice, ⁷ and I have seen among the simple, I have perceived among the youths, a young man lacking sense, ⁸ passing along the street near her corner, taking the road to her house ⁹ in the twilight, in the evening, at the time of night and darkness.

MOVE THE LINE

B. SEEKAND YOU WILL FIND!

i. Temptation, "Lust of the eye," She grabs his attention (7:10-12):

¹⁰ And behold, the woman meets him, dressed as a prostitute, wily of heart. ¹¹ She is loud and wayward; her feet do not stay at home; ¹² now in the street, now in the market, and at every corner she lies in wait



ii. Pressure intensifies (7:13-21)

She seizes him and kisses him, MING! IT JUST HAPPPENED!!

and with bold face shasses to him ¹⁴ "I had to offer sacrifices, and today I have paid my vows;

15 so now I have come out to meet you, to seek you eagerly, and I have found you,

¹⁶I have spread my couch with coverings, colored linens from Egyptian linen; ¹⁷I have perfumed my bed with myrrh, aloes, and cinnamon.

18 Come, let us take our fill of love till morning; let us delight ourselves with love

19 For my husband is not at home; he has gene on a long journey; 20 he took a bag of money with him; at full moon he will come home

III. THE SUCCUMBING! (7:22-23)


²² All at once he follows her as an ox goes to the slaughter, or as a stag is caught fast ²³ till an arrow pierces its liver; as a bird rushes into a snare; he does not know that it will cost him his life



IV. Consequences (Prov. 6:27-35; 7:27)

Can a man scoop a flame into his lap and not have his clothes catch on fire? 28 Can he walk on hot coals and not blister his feet? ²⁹So it is with the man who sleeps with another man's wife. He who embraces her will not go unpunished. 30 Excuses might be found for a thief who steals because he is starving. 31 But if he is caught, he must pay back seven times what he stole, even if he has to sell everything in his house. ³²But the man who commits adultery is an utter fool, for he destroys himself. 33He will be wounded and disgraced. His shame will never be erased. ³⁴For the woman's jealous husband will be furious, and he will show no mercy when he takes revenge. ³⁵He will accept no compensation, nor be satisfied with a payoff of any size.

V. FINALTHOUGHTS/ADMONITIONS (7:24-27)

And now, O sons, listen to me, and be attentive to the words of my mouth. Let not your heart turn aside to her ways; do not stray into her paths, for many a victim has she laid low, and all her slain are a mighty throng. Her house is the way to Sheol, going down to the chambers of death

Is God's Word Absolutely, Indisputably True?

Is Jesus Christ the Only Begotten Son of the Father, the Second Person of the Trinity?

The Word of God provides tempted believers (You and me) great hope. First, it proclaims a Savior who has faced temptation at its greatest strength and defeated it finally, ultimately, and decisively

Then it proclaims these truths about us. We are:

- (1) Declared not-guilty,
- (2) Decisively and permanently adopted,
- (3) Born again from above
 - (a) Given new hearts
 - (b) Given new inclinations,
- (4) Indwelled fully by the Spirit of Christ,
- (5) Crucified and buried with Christ,
- (6) Raised and seated with Christ, and
- (7) Receiving the ongoing merciful intercession of Christ and the Holy Spirit.
