

I. Introduction to God and Creation Gen 1:1

The Bible never attempts to explain, justify, or defend God as the Creator of the universe. The truth is boldly stated

as a fact and is affirmed by Bible poetry, Psalm 102:25, and Bible prophecy, Isaiah 40:21.

The reader needs to stop here. Why? Because what follows is the pre-fall narrative of creation, man and the early earth up to Genes chapter 3. Since man can only view this from a post fall perspective. It is necessary to address the post fall perspective of man, its limitations and how scripture calls us to address them. Therefore our study will begin with chapter 3 and the fall.

It is only through a right relationship with God through the person of Jesus Christ that man can come to rightly understanding of creation, himself and his eternal destiny.

 - In the Beginning was the Word. John 1:1
 - What does Jesus tell us about creation?
 - a. It's personal.... Jesus is very personal.
 - b. It's inclusive... "everything"
 - c. It is His.
 - d. It is intimate.... And God said.....
 - B. "and the world was formless and void and darkness.
 - How did Satan end up on the earth?
 - The cosmic battle and creation of the earth
 - The fall of Adam and provision of a savior
 - The destruction of world by flood and the ark and the covenant.
 - The exodus and giving of the law. Pharaoh is defeated
 - The death of Jesus Christ and Resurrection.
 - The tribulation and the millennial kingdom
 - The attack of satan's forces and the final judgement.

Note: The dualistic side of man. Sin is not an ability: the "ability" to lie is better understood as the inability to embrace the truth, an open display of a lack of character, a deficit of conscience, a hole in a person where the image of God should be. Example, God who cannot lie, is not saying God does not have the ability to lie, as God is lacking something, hard for man to see it that way. As a part of this self-deception Cain displays major deficit in his character, a big black hole where once there was the image of God. He murders his brother and goes about his business. No acknowledgement, no remorse, no accounting and nobody else's business even when it is brought to his attention. This is seen time from time in the scriptures. David has Uriah killed and seems to be fine with it until it is pointed out quite adroitly by Nathan, also an example of a true friend. When men decided to separate themselves from the image of God. God may in his love and kindness have the black hole brought to the persons attention by a true friend. Nathan by being a true friend of God is by default a true friend of David. Because sin in any from is self-destructive.
