
- The term "Agape" is used here for love. "The noun occurs 116 times across twenty-six New Testament books. It is never used of romantic passion and only rarely of natural affection. Rather, it denotes a holy, self-giving disposition that originates in God, is displayed perfectly in Jesus Christ, and is implanted in believers by the Holy Spirit."

- Eiréné one, peace, quietness, rest.
- Probably from a primary verb eiro (to join); peace (literally or figuratively); by implication, prosperity — one, peace, quietness, rest, + set at one again. A peace that comes from unity or togetherness, possibly.
- What is the connection between peace and thankfulness?
- What habits do we have that destroy our peace?
- Does anyone have any examples of a peace that comes from God?
