I. The Kingdom Splits under Solomon

Key point: IK 1-11 Solomon's building of the temple IK 9:1-9 God's promise to Solomon—The Deal IK 12 God through a prophet prevents open war, but Jeroboam sets up golden calves at Bethel and Dan—that sets the pattern for Israel for the next 210 years IK 16:29 Ahab becomes king of Israel—it's been bad, but Ahab makes it worse

II. Elijah and Elisha

17:24 widow at Zarephath: "now I know that you are a man of God …"
Mt. Carmel story: The absolutely mind-boggling rebellion of Israel
IK 20-21 God will forgive even Ahab if he repents
IIK 1 Elijah is God's representative, and in 2 he passes that on to Elisha
IIK 3 Elisha saves both Israel and Judah from the Moabites
IIK 4-5 oil, son, pot, loaves, leprosy—who is this?
IIK 13 death of Elisha
The prophets show us God's explanation for the evil in their culture; do we have a deal with God?

Repent!
1:15 Day of the Lord (5x)
The 3-part cycles
Compare the prophesies here to Deut. 28-30
Key passage: 2:28-32
Whoever calls on the name of the Lord will be saved (Rom. 10:13)

Amos The perfect number ...

Obadiah

Jacob I have loved, but Esau I have hated Malachi 1:3 Message: God will judge those who set themselves against His people—justice is coming

Jonah

This is a story for everyone who's sick to death of a corrupt culture, and you just don't feel like witnessing anymore: 4:1-11 Should I not be concerned about that great city?
