## V. Discussion

- A. When God says Job is "blameless and upright" (1:8) and when Job claims innocence or guiltlessness (16:17, "although there is no violence in my hands and my prayer is pure," and again in 17:9, "the righteous will hold to his way, and he who has clean hands will grow stronger," referring to himself), does it mean that he never sins or does it mean something else? How would you know?
- B. Job says in 16:6 that if he speaks, things do not get better, and if he is quiet, things don't get better either. Since this is only chapter 18 and he will speak three more times (= 8 chapters), he apparently decides to keep speaking. Why does he speak? Is it good or is it not? Why does he want his cry to not be silenced (16:18)? What makes you say that?
- C. In 16:19-21, Job makes two interesting statements.
  - 1. My witness is in heaven and my advocate is on high.
  - 2. Oh that a man might plead with God as a man his neighbor!

What significance do these two statements have for a Christian? Please consider Romans 8:26, 34 in putting together your response.
