Review: simple message

Encouragement to Jewish believers to hold on to their faith

As it is said,

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"Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion."

¹⁶ For who were those who heard and yet rebelled? Was it not all those who left Egypt led by Moses? ¹⁷ And with whom was he provoked for forty years? Hebrews 6:7–8 (ESV)

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Though we speak in this way, yet in your case, beloved, we feel sure of better things—things that belong to salvation. ¹⁰ For God is not unjust so as to overlook your work and the love that you have shown for his name in serving the saints, as you still do. ¹¹ And we desire each one of you to show the same earnestness to have the full assurance of hope until the end, ¹² so that you may not be sluggish, but imitators of those who through faith and patience inherit the promises.

Intro to Warning Passage

What does the warning concern?Who are being warned?What is the consequence for NOT heeding the warning?What exactly is it that's IMPOSSIBLE?

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About this [concerning him] we have much to say, and it is hard to explain, since you have become dull of hearing. Hebrews 5:11 (ESV)

- Choosing to be lazy, *sluggish*
- No longer excited to learn

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- No longer trying to understand
- Unwilling to act on what you hear; know
- Unwilling to seek understanding & insight

For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the <u>basic principles</u> of the oracles of God. Hebrews 5:12a (ESV)

... to teach you the <u>elementary truths</u> of **God's word** all over again. You need milk, not solid food! (NIV)

... to teach you the <u>beginning elements</u> of God's utterances. You have gone back to needing milk, not solid food. (NET 2nd ed.)

Oracles – with *τοῦ θεοῦ* or *θεοῦ* added, relates to His commands in the Mosaic law and His Messianic promises; Greek Lexicon; Thayer

Observations: *solid food*

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Hebrews 6:1 – 6 (UAV)

Observations: *Who are they?*

"... in the case of those who have once been enlightened, [and] who have tasted the heavenly gift, and have shared in the Holy Spirit, ⁵ and have tasted the goodness of the word of God and the powers of the age to come, ⁶ and then have fallen away,"

Observations: the land

For land that has drunk the rain that often falls on it, and produces a crop *useful* to those for whose sake it is cultivated, receives a <u>blessing from God</u>.

Hebrews 6:7–8 (ESV)

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For it is impossible for true (actual) believers who have been once enlightened, and have accepted the heavenly gift, and have been indwelt by the Holy Spirit, and have experienced the good word of the gospel and the power of the coming kingdom; and then they fail to live their daily life by faith in Christ, to return by means of repentance to a place where they can escape God's curse (temporal chastisement and eternal loss of reward), because they have openly claimed that Christ's sacrifice was insufficient to maintain fellowship with God and they have publicly embarrassed and dishonored Christ, their patron.

Let me illustrate the impossibility of escaping God's curse by means of an allusion to the OT blessing/cursing motif:

The earth which drinks in the rain (accepts the gospel) and produces good fruit (lives by faith) for the one who tends the crops receives blessing from God. However, the land that drinks the rain (accepts the gospel) and does not produce good fruit (does not live by faith) receives the curse of God.
