




The Purpose of Trials

#### A true change in character can only come by way of trials.





# The Force of Temptation

"In our members there is a slumbering inclination towards desire which is both sudden and fierce. With irresistible power desire seizes mastery over the flesh. All at once a secret, smouldering fire is kindled. The flesh burns and is in flames. It makes no difference whether it is sexual desire, or ambition, or vanity, or desire for revenge, or love of fame and power, or greed for money, or, finally, that strange desire for the beauty of the world, of nature. Joy in God is in course of being extinguished in us and we seek all our joy in the creature. At this moment God is quite unreal to us, he loses all reality, and only desire for the creature is real; the only reality is the devil. Satan does not here fill us with hatred of God, but with forgetfulness of God. . . . The lust thus aroused envelops the mind and will of man in deepest darkness. The powers of clear discrimination and of decision are taken from us. . . . It is here that everything within me rises up against the Word of God."






# The Types of Temptation

- We can be tempted to quit or give up; act like a victim




#### Joseph in Prison Genesis 39:20 to 40:23




And Joseph's master took him and put him into the prison, the place where the king's prisoners were confined, and he was there in prison. *Genesis 39:20* 












# In the pit again!






# In the pit again!


#### These verses express a promise:

And he who searches hearts **knows** what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. <sup>28</sup>And we **know** that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose. Romans 8:27-28





<sup>21</sup>But the LORD was with Joseph and showed him steadfast love and gave him favor in the sight of the keeper of the prison.
<sup>22</sup>And the keeper of the prison put Joseph in charge of all the prisoners who were in the prison. Whatever was done there, he was the one who did it.
<sup>23</sup>The keeper of the prison paid no attention to anything that was in Joseph's charge, because the LORD was with him. And whatever he did, the LORD made it succeed. *Genesis 39:21-23*





# What was it about Joseph that caught the attention of the keeper?




(or should we just assume that God turned the heart of the keeper and Joseph's contribution was minimal?)





Some time after this, the cupbearer of the king of Egypt and his baker committed an offense against their lord the king of Egypt. <sup>2</sup>And Pharaoh was angry with his two officers, the *chief cupbearer* and the *chief baker*, <sup>3</sup>and **he put them in custody** in the house of the captain of the guard, **in the prison where Joseph was confined**. *Genesis 40:1-3* 





# The Significance of Dreams and Visions

- They have always played an important part in the literature and religion of all peoples.
- They have become both the source and the explanation of otherwise inexplicable acts of Providence
- They have become the working material of the prophet both Biblical and pagan.




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
# The Significance of Dreams and Visions

For God speaks in one way, and in two, though man does not perceive it. <sup>15</sup>In a dream, in a vision of the night, when deep sleep falls on men, while they slumber on their beds, <sup>16</sup>then he opens the ears of men and terrifies them with warnings, <sup>17</sup>that he may turn man aside from his deed and conceal pride from a man; <sup>18</sup>he keeps back his soul from the pit, his life from perishing by the sword. *Job 33:14-18 (Elibu rebukes Job)* 





The *captain of the guard* **appointed Joseph** to be with them, and he attended them. They *continued for some time* in custody. And one night they both dreamed – the cupbearer and the baker of the king of Egypt, who were confined in the prison – **each his own dream**, and each dream with its own interpretation. <sup>6</sup>When Joseph came to them in the morning, *he saw that they were troubled*. *Genesis* 40:4-6




#### What stands out in Gen. 41:4-6?







So he asked **Pharaoh's officers** who were with him in custody in his master's house, "Why are your faces downcast today?" <sup>8</sup>They said to him, "We have had dreams, and there is no one to interpret them." And Joseph said to them, **"Do not interpretations belong to God? Please tell them to me."** *Genesis 40:7-8* 






What grabs your attention in verses 7 and 8?





So the chief cupbearer told his dream to Joseph and said to him, "In my dream there was a vine before me, <sup>10</sup>and on the vine there were three branches. As soon as it budded, its blossoms shot forth, and the clusters ripened into grapes. <sup>11</sup>Pharaoh's cup was in my hand, and I took the grapes and pressed them into Pharaoh's cup and placed the cup in Pharaoh's hand." *Genesis 40:9-11* 








Then Joseph said to him, "This is its interpretation: the three branches are three days. <sup>13</sup>In three days Pharaoh will lift up your head and restore you to your office, and you shall place Pharaoh's cup in his hand as formerly, when you were his cupbearer.

<sup>14</sup>Only remember me, when it is well with you, and please do me the kindness to mention me to Pharaoh, and so get me out of this house. <sup>15</sup>For I was indeed stolen out of the land of the Hebrews, and here also I have done nothing that they should put me into the pit." *Genesis 40:12-15* 











# The Lord was with him

When the chief baker saw that the interpretation was favorable, he said to Joseph, "I also had a dream: there were three cake baskets on my head, <sup>17</sup>and in the uppermost basket there were all sorts of baked food for Pharaoh, but the birds were eating it out of the basket on my head." <sup>18</sup>And Joseph answered and said, "This is its interpretation: the three baskets are three days. <sup>19</sup>In three days Pharaoh will lift up your head—from you!—and hang you on a tree. And the birds will eat the flesh from you." *Genesis 40:16-19* 





On the third day, which was Pharaoh's birthday, he made a feast for all his servants and lifted up the head of the chief cupbearer and the head of the chief baker among his servants. <sup>21</sup>He restored the chief cupbearer to his position, and he placed the cup in Pharaoh's hand. <sup>22</sup>But he hanged the chief baker, as Joseph had interpreted to them. *Genesis 40:20-22* 






Yet the chief cupbearer did not remember Joseph, but forgot him.
