### II. DAVID'S ROLE IN OT REVELATION

The overarching theme of the Bible is God restoring his kingship over a rebellious humanity—saving them, restoring them, reconciling them to Himself and submitting His rule

- Rev. 19:11-16, 21:1-8

#### David the Type of Christ
