The overarching theme of the Bible is God restoring his kingship over a rebellious humanity—saving them, restoring them, reconciling them to Himself and submitting His rule

Rev. 19:11-16, 21:1-8

David the Type of Christ
David represents someone, but he is only
God acts to create for His purposes a nation, with people, law, land, and king
But just as the people are rebellious (disobedient) and therefore cannot take the land nor keep the Law, s the OT king cannot rule perfectly, leading to, and, and
