1. Worship Begins with Faith

Genesis 12:1-9; 15:1-6

Worship flows from trust—not from what we see, but from who He is.

2. Worship Requires Action

Genesis 16–18

Worship is demonstrated when we choose faithfulness over comfort or control.

3. Worship Culminates in Surrender

Genesis 22:1–14; Hebrews 11:17–19

The highest form of worship is surrender—trusting God completely with what we love most.

4. Worship as a Way of Life

Romans 12:1-2

Worship is presenting ourselves as living sacrifices—our daily obedience is worship.

5. Transformation Through Worship

2 Corinthians 3:18

Worship reorients our hearts from self-focused to God-focused.

6. True Worship

John 4:23–24; Psalm 29:2; Matthew 4:10; Matthew 15:8–9 True worship is from the heart and aligned with truth.

7. Worship and Service

Colossians 3:17

When worship is genuine, it overflows into serving others with love.

- 1. Where in your life is God asking you to trust Him even when you can't see the outcome?
- 2. When following God is costly or uncomfortable, how do you respond in worship?
- 3. What "Isaac" might God be asking you to surrender—something precious you're holding too tightly?
- 4. How might a posture of worship change the way you grow, serve, or relate to others?
- 5. What keeps your worship from being wholehearted or genuine?
