PSALM 63, NKJV

63 O God, You are my God; Early will I seek You; My soul thirsts for You; My flesh longs for You In a dry and thirsty land Where there is no water. ² So I have looked for You in the sanctuary, To see Your power and Your glory. ³ Because Your lovingkindness *is* better than life. My lips shall praise You. ⁴ Thus I will bless You while I live: I will lift up my hands in Your name. ⁵ My soul shall be satisfied as with marrow and fatness.
