Message Summary:

This week as we investigate the triumphant entry of our Lord Jesus the Christ Pastor Kevin sheds light on 3 distinct perspectives that reveal who Jesus is. He is the promised King, Prince of Peace, Promised Judge. However, this is not so triumphant. We will learn that although Jesus is Glorified by those titles praising God the people rejected calling Him by those titles and Jesus begins to weep.

Group Discussion:

What are some key takeaways from this weekend's message? Why is this so impactful to you?

Pastor Kevin made this statement "Who you believe Jesus is will dictate your response to who He is."

1. In your own words what does this statement mean to you?

<u>Jesus is the Promised King</u> — We learned that in the ancient times whenever there was a conquering king, The King would enter the city on a stallion. Jesus enters Jerusalem ready to pronounce His Kingship. Read: Luke 19:30-31; Zechariah 9:9: John 12:12-15.

- 1. Share with the group the moment God saved you? do you remember your response?
- 2. Is Jesus the King or Lord of your life?

<u>Jesus is the Prince of Peace – Pastor Kevin taught us, Jesus was not coming in peace. He was coming to bring peace.</u> When a king would arrive to a city on a donkey it was a sign that the king is coming in peace. Read Luke 19: 41-42; Romans 5:1; Colossians 1:19-20.

1. The people wanted peace on their terms, and not His. Do you find yourself asking God for something to be done on your terms? If so, why do you think we can cause more stress for our lives by thinking this way?



Jesus is the Promised Judge – There was an unworthy woman, a prostitute, Jesus tells this woman "your sins are forgiven". This woman begins to anoint His feet with an expensive perfume. Read <u>Luke 19: 45-46</u>; Isaiah 56:7; Revelation 19:11-13.

- 1. What have you noticed about how Jesus is going to come back? Is He riding on a donkey when He returns. What does this mean to you?
- 2. Does this create an urgency in your heart to tell someone about Jesus?

Weekly Reflection:

- 1. Based on how the Spirit has spoken to you this week, what is one action step you want to take this week to align yourself more fully with Scripture?
- 2. How has your time with God, in the Word and in prayer, been this past week?
- 3. What personal spiritual struggle(s) are you facing right now and how will you actively surrender them to God this week? (Marriage, parenting, work, finances, relationships, personal strongholds/sin, etc.)
- 4. What else can we be praying with you about this week?
