 - A. God's power is limited.
 - B. If God were all powerful, He would do what I think He should do.
 - C. The laws of nature are what govern the universe, not God.
 - D. God's power is determined by what He has already done.
 - E. God can do anything and everything. (God can not contradict His nature: Hebrews 6:17-18; Titus 1:2; James 1:13)
- 6. Application of the omnipotence of God
 - A. Because God is all-powerful, we should fear Him: Jeremiah 5:22-2; Luke 12:4-5
 - B. Because God is all powerful and the gospel is the power of God of all who believe, we should be motivated to evangelize the lost.
