1 Corinthians 5-7: The Sacred Life

Sermon: 1 Corinthians 7:25-40

Date: Sunday, November 23, 2025

1. How does Paul's teaching that our identity and fulfillment come from Christ alone challenge the cultural messages we receive about needing romantic relationships to be complete?
2. Pastor Jared talked about how it can feel like the other lane in traffic is always moving faster. In your own life, where do you feel God calling you to stay faithful in the lane you're currently in?
3. How does viewing our circumstances through an eternal perspective rather than a temporal one change the way we approach decisions about marriage and singleness? How does this change how we prioritize the way we use our time, talent, and treasures in both marriage and singleness? (see Matthew 6:19-21)

4. Paul shows that both married and single believers are vital to the church—one isn't better than the other, just different. In what ways do married and single people each contribute to advancing God's kingdom?
5. Is there someone—married or single—whose life has shown you what it looks like to live for the kingdom of God? What about their example stood out to you?
6. Pastor Jared said: "Our peace, security, fulfillment, our joy, and our identity is not found in our situation or relationship status, but in Jesus Christ alone." How does this truth challenge the way you think about contentment in your life?
7. How does contentment in Christ make the gospel visible to the people around us—our friends, co-workers, and family? Practically, what might that look like this week?
