4. The sermon mentioned four ways to engage missionally:

  - Language - Avoiding "Christianese"
  - Community - Being present in local events
  - Service - Laying down preferences to reach the lost

5. Share about someone in your life who doesn't know Jesus. What specific barriers (cultural, relational, or otherwise) might exist in sharing the gospel with them? How might you "contextualize" your approach
6. Paul contrasts the "perishable wreath" with the "imperishable crown." What are some "perishable wreaths" our culture (or we personally) chase after?
7. Justin Tuck's testimony about winning the Super Bowl revealed that earthly achievements can't fill the God-shaped hole in our hearts. Have you ever achieved something you thought would satisfy you, only to find it didn't? What did that teach you?
8. Paul talks about disciplining his body and not running "aimlessly." How do spiritual disciplines help maintain an eternal focus? Which ones do you need to strengthen?
