Introduction: When God Is Amazed

"And He marvelled because of their unbelief." - Mark 6:6, KJV

"When Jesus heard it, He marvelled..." - Matthew 8:10, KJV

Let me begin with a question:

Can the Creator of heaven and earth ever be surprised? Can the All-Knowing God be amazed?

According to Scripture - yes!

The Gospels tell us of only two times Jesus "marvelled":

- Once because of **unbelief** (Mark 6:6), and
- Once because of **great faith** (Matthew 8:10).

So, what makes God marvel?

Unbelief and faith!

This message is about stirring up Great Faith that pleases God - and bringing down revival in the month of Av, the time of Comfort and Jov.



🍑 I. Jesus Marvelled at Unbelief (Mark 6:1–6)

Let's start where Jesus marvelled at what should not have been - unbelief.

"And He could there do no mighty work... And He marvelled because of their unbelief." - Mark 6:5-6



Context:

- Jesus returns to His hometown (Nazareth).
- They knew His background carpenter, Mary's son and rejected His divinity.
- The **familiarity** became a barrier to faith.



Familiarity breeds contempt and kills expectation.



Lesson:

Even the **Son of God was limited** not by lack of power, but by lack of **faith** in the people.

1 Let us repent of doubt and open our hearts for revival!




🙀 II. Jesus Marvelled at Great Faith: The Centurion

(Matthew 8:5–10, 13)

This Roman Centurion wasn't Jewish. He wasn't religious. Yet, his faith caused Jesus to marvel!

"When Jesus heard it, He marvelled, and said... I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel." - Matthew 8:10




Keys to the Centurion's Great Faith:

- 1. Humility
 - "I am not worthy..." (v.8)
 - He recognized his unworthiness, yet still believed.
- 2. Understanding Authority:
 - "Speak the word only, and my servant shall be healed."
 - He understood **kingdom dynamics**: Jesus didn't need to be physically present
 - His Word carried power!
- 3. Belief in the Power of Jesus' Word

No need for a sign - just the Word was enough!

! Illustration:

Imagine someone saying to the President, "No need to come. Just send an order." That's faith in authority!



III. The Canaanite Woman (Matthew 15:22–28): Persistent, Bold Faith

This woman had every reason to be discouraged:

- She was **not a Jew** (a Canaanite).
- Jesus ignored her at first.
- The disciples told her to go away.
- Jesus even said she was **not part of His mission!**

Yet she **refused to give up**.

"O woman, great is thy faith: be it unto thee even as thou wilt." - Matthew 15:28



- 1. **Persistence in prayer** She kept crying out.
- 2. Reverence and worship "Then came she and worshipped Him ..."
- Faith draws heaven's attention!

She didn't ask permission. She didn't wait for an altar call.

"If I may touch but His clothes, I shall be whole." - Mark 5:28

And when she touched Him...

"Jesus... said, Who touched my clothes?... Virtue had gone out of Him." - Mark 5:30

Her Faith Was:

- **Personal** "If *I* may touch"
- **Determined** She pressed through the crowd
- Expectant She believed for results before seeing them

Rich Faith

This woman had **no name** in the passage, but her **faith had a reputation** in heaven!

"If I may touch but His clothes, I shall be whole." — Mark 5:28, KJV

She had **suffered for twelve years**, spent all her money on physicians, and was considered unclean by Jewish law. Yet, she pressed in through the crowd to touch the hem of Jesus' garment.

"And Jesus, immediately knowing in Himself that virtue had gone out of Him, turned... and said, Who touched My clothes?" — Mark 5:30, KJV

When others brushed against Him casually, this woman touched Him with faith — and virtue (power) flowed from Jesus!

Rich Faith in a Poor Vessel

Though this woman was physically weak, financially broke, and socially rejected, her faith was spiritually rich.

"Hearken, my beloved brethren, Hath not God chosen the poor of this world rich in faith, and heirs of the kingdom which He hath promised to them that love Him?" — James 2:5, KJV

This is what we call "Rich Faith" — not based on what's in your wallet or your social status, but what's in your **heart!**

Related Scriptures:

- Mark 5:26 "She had suffered many things... and was nothing bettered, but rather grew worse..."
- Luke 6:20 "Blessed be ye poor: for yours is the kingdom of God."
- **Luke 12:21** "So is he that layeth up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God."

Key Truth:

You may be **empty in your bank account**, but **overflowing in faith**. God is not moved by riches, but by faith that is rich in dependence, desperation, and determination.



She didn't wait for Jesus to touch her. She reached out with Rich Faith and drew healing from Him

☆ Closing Charge: Activate Great Faith!

Revival breaks out where faith is alive.

God is not looking for talent, education, or status - He is looking for faith!

- 3. Lord, speak Your Word and let healing flow into my life
- 4. Like the Centurion, I trust in Your authority and Word!
- 5. Make me persistent like the Canaanite woman. Let nothing stop my faith
- 6. Father, let virtue flow from Jesus into every area of my life physically, financially, and spiritually
- 7. This month of Av, I receive joy, comfort, and revival in my home, church, and nation!
