Reflection Questions

What part of the Bible passage we read together (1 Peter 1:3-7a) sticks in your mind the most? (Ex. "Now we live with great expectation," "living hope," "you are more precious than mere gold," etc.)

Take a moment and write that part of the passage down on a small piece of paper. Consider putting it somewhere you will see it often. What might God be trying to say to you through these words?

How does it make you feel knowing that living hope is based on something that has already happened (Jesus being raised from the dead) rather than just something we expect in the future?

Josh mentioned that our adoption into God's family doesn't depend on anything we do, anything we have, or anything people say about us. Believing that God's love for us depends on one or more of these three things can be a difficult lie to untangle. Is there one of these lies that you find yourself believing most often?

How might hearing God's word about living hope help you untangle these lies about Christian life and identity? (i.e. Where does our hope, life, and identity come from?)
