#### **Opening Discussion**

 What thoughts, feelings, or impressions do you have about the sermon this week?

### Thought #1: God has great plans for each of us personally.

Read Ephesians 4:4-8

"For there is one body and one Spirit, just as you have been called to one glorious hope for the future. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all, in all, and living through all. However, he has given each one of us a special gift through the generosity of Christ. That is why the Scriptures say, "When he ascended to the heights, he led a crowd of captives and gave gifts to his people."

Pastor Kevin reminded us through this passage that God cares for each of us individually. He loves you and created you with specific gifts and talents for a unique purpose. He has a plan for your life!

Take time to reflect on these unique gifts and talents that the Lord has given to you. To identify these, ask yourself these questions:

What's a task or role that comes easily for me?

What do I excel at or find joy in doing? What is something others ask for my help with?

How would people describe my character or personality?

The answers to these questions are likely your natural gifts and talents. And each of them is valuable in and of itself! Share what came to mind with your group. How do you or can you use these gifts and talents for the Kingdom?

### Thought #2: God has great plans for us as a community.

Read Ephesians 4:11-16

"So, Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors, and teachers, to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ. Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming. Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work."

While we are each uniquely and specifically equipped for good works, we were never meant to do them alone! The beautiful way our gifts weave together with the gifts of

others creates a stunning work we could not do individually.

In community, we are also able to more readily grow and mature in our faith. Think about this very group you are sitting in right now. How has coming together in THIS community impacted your growth in your walk with Jesus? How have you seen your walk move from infancy to maturity? How are you still being challenged to grow and mature?

Pastor Kevin reminded us that growing often comes from listening AND following. Hearing what the Lord is saying to us and responding with obedience.

What does it look like for you to take a posture of listening? Where or when do you listen best? Is there a need to carve out time and space for you to listen to Jesus?

In what areas are you choosing to follow Him? Are there places He is asking you to step into that you struggle to say yes? Is there a "But" to your obedience?

i.e., I will follow Him, BUT if He calls me to be a missionary in another country I am out!

Taking it one step further, what is He calling you to surrender? Psalm 24:1-2 says "The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it; for he founded it on the seas and established it on the waters."

We often cling tightly to the things we love the most, forgetting that it is all the Lord's! What resource, gift, or talent is hardest for you to surrender? (i.e. time, money, reputation, etc.) What would it look like in your life to say "It's all yours...do with it what you want?" What would change in your life with this statement?

#### Response

How is God challenging you through this On Mission series? What does it look like for you to live on mission in your daily life? Are there specific places He's calling you to give, serve, or surrender? How can your group walk with you in this through prayer, accountability, and support?
