TAKE IT WITH YOU

Fellowship has always been a cornerstone of the Christian faith. Sometimes, we church folk use the word fellowship interchangeably with any form of socializing that happens in the church, but truly, the time we spend getting to know one another, sharing our lives and experiences is never wasted. God never intended for us to walk this journey alone, without support. Jesus even spoke to His disciples about their relationship with one another, urging them to unite and proclaiming that their love for one another would be how people would know they were Christ-followers. Our connection with brothers and sisters in Christ is not just comforting and helpful, it is essential to our growth and to our witness to others. It's so important that our church (and most others) have time for that connection baked into our regular weekly rhythm. At Snyder, we call it Sunday School.

Some of my earliest memories of church are in the Sunday school class. As a child, I can remember memorizing Bible verses and learning the stories of the Bible. As I grew up, I not only learned more about the Bible and Jesus, but learned to read and study the Bible, to ask questions and work out the answers. Over the years, I have had numerous discussions in a Sunday school class that were eye-opening, challenging, inspiring, thought-provoking, even life changing.

But Sunday School is about more than just the lesson...it's about the people in the class with you. In Sunday school classes, I have created some of the deepest, most significant friendships. Sunday school classmates have provided support, prayer, accountability, love, laughter and celebration.

This invitation is extended every week, but allow me to add to it in writing: if you do not currently attend a Sunday school class, I encourage you to give it a shot. Ask someone near you in worship if you can attend with them. Stop by the Welcome Desk in the Gathering Hall after the 8:40 service, or next week around 9:40 or so and ask if someone will direct you to a class. Visit the Snyder website for a list of classes. Any member of staff or member of the church would be happy to help. Just take that first step to get into a small group of people who would love for their circle to get just a bit bigger. The connections you make there will help you to discover God, develop your faith, and display Christ-like love.

This afternoon we install four new deacons. What does that mean? Deacon is a transliteration of the Greek word meaning servant. The Bible gives us two examples of people who were deacons in this regard: Stephen (Acts 6:1-7) and Phoebe (Romans 16:1-2). Stephen served by distributing food to widows and Phoebe served both a particular church and the early mission endeavors of the Apostle Paul. The result of their service was church growth.

While our deacons are set apart for 36 months of servitude, together all members engage in the actions of the movement Jesus started. Deacons are those women and men who our members have elected as role models and examples of servant partners in the Good News.
