TAKE IT WITH YOU

Jesus, give me what I want.

The first line in this parable has a man making this request...or rather a demand of Jesus. As Luke relays the story, the man approaches Jesus and wants Him to make his brother divide the inheritance with him. Now, Luke doesn't give us any other details, but we can assume that the man who is speaking is likely the younger brother. According to Jewish customs at the time, the bulk of a father's property would pass to the eldest son. It's safe to assume that the eldest son had the choice of what to do with that estate; he could divide it with his brothers or keep it for himself. Clearly, that is what the brother of the speaker in verse 13 was going to do: keep the estate for himself. The younger brother was unhappy with that and wanted Jesus to command him to comply with the younger brother's wishes. Jesus, in true Jesus fashion, said "that's not what I'm here for" and proceeded to teach everyone a lesson, not about equitable division of inheritance or accepting one's lot in life according to societal customs, but about placing too much importance on earthly treasures and acquiring wealth.

I don't know about you, but I bet I'm not the only one who has acted more like that younger brother in the story than I'd like to admit. All too often, my prayers sound a little like I am telling Jesus how I would like things to work out, rather than asking Him to make His will be done in my life. I carefully lay out my case for why I am right and someone else is wrong, rather than asking the Holy Spirit to reveal to me how I can "act justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with my God". I pray for retribution, not reconciliation; for revenge, not justice. I ask for an easy path, not for God's presence and provision, whatever the path may bring. I want a quick answer, rather than waiting, trusting in God, who has promised and proved over and over that He is faithful.

I am not implying that it is wrong for us to ask God for the desires of our heart. That is our invitation, to lay all our cares before Him. The key is to do so with a humble heart and a contrite spirit; recognizing that He is God and we are not, that He knows what is best for us in a way we could not possibly know. We must take care to think of our prayers, not as demands of a powerful person, but petitions to an all-mighty God who created us, who loves us, and is working all things together for our good, according to His purpose.

LUKE 12:13-21

¹³ Someone in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me." ¹⁴ But he said to him, "Man, who made me a judge or arbitrator over you?" ¹⁵ And he said to them, "Take care, and be on your guard against all covetousness, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions." ¹⁶ And he told them a parable, saying, "The land of a rich man produced plentifully, ¹⁷ and he thought to himself, 'What shall I do, for I have nowhere to store my crops?' ¹⁸ And he said, 'I will do this: I will tear down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. ¹⁹ And I will say to my soul, "Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry."' ²⁰ But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul is required of you, and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' ²¹ So is the one who lays up treasure for himself and is not rich toward God."
