Now grandchildren have been covered in the beautiful quilts made by Mrs. Barefoot, and play with the huge Raggedy Ann and Andy dolls that she also made for our girls.

Mr. and Mrs. Barefoot's leadership was authentic, just as we have seen their son, Robert Barefoot love and minister to our refugee families so well.

Those little babies Mr. and Mrs. Barefoot prayed for are now teaching their babies to pray. One of our granddaughters recently thanked God for, "everybody and I mean EV-ER-Y body that you made!" Oh that we would have childlike purity and love for all people with that same gusto!

INFLUENCER | DAMAGE CONTROL

In this series we are considering the life and leadership of Nehemiah. While he is not a Professional Influencer in the modern sense, he is an InfluenceR with social and spiritual impact. His life reveals traits of a Good Influencer we should emulate as an Ambassador of Jesus (II Corinthians 5:20).
