TAKE IT WITH YOU

Resilience is hard. We have lots of phrases in our vernacular to encourage us to be resilient: "Pull yourself up by your bootstraps"

"Get back on the horse"

"If at first you don't succeed, try, try again."

But the truth is that doing so is really difficult, even painful, in real life. There is something so demoralizing about putting forth effort, sometimes tremendous amounts of effort, doing everything "right" and things still don't work out like you want them to or like they were promised. It's all too easy to throw up your hands, walk away, and say "forget it...it's too hard...! give up!"

I don't always think of resilience as being a particularly spiritual concept; but the truth is that we have examples of people being resilient throughout the Bible. Sometimes it's easy to miss because we're getting kind of a compressed, third-person account of the story, and we know the ending. Think of all that some of our heroes of the faith were put up against: Noah, Joseph, Moses, David, Jeremiah, Daniel, Nehemiah...just to name a few, and that's just the Old Testament. These people had to be resilient in the face of danger, resistance, violence, persecution and contempt. How easy it would have been for any of these people to give in to the very human instinct to give up when faced with failure and challenges.

So, what was their secret? How did they have what it took to keep going when the going got tough? How can we emulate them when we face obstacles? The one thing they all had in common was faith in God. We can cry out to God to give us strength to persist, because our strength will never be enough. Isaiah 41:10 says:

"Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

Our own strength will only take us so far and our human weakness defaults to the path of least resistance, which by definition is not resilient at all. But when we lean on the everlasting arms of our Heavenly Father and rely on His strength, then we "can do all things through Christ, who gives [us] strength." (PHILIPPIANS 4:13).

INFLUENCER | RELENTLESS RESILIENCE

In this series we are considering the life and leadership of Nehemiah. While he is not a Professional Influencer in the modern sense, he is an InfluenceR with social and spiritual impact. His life reveals traits of a Good Influencer we should emulate as an Ambassador of Jesus (II Corinthians 5:20).

We all encounter resistance. We cannot ignore it. We should not be surprised by it, rather we should be ready for it, and Nehemiah's example shows us how.

As we consider some of the resistance Nehemiah faced, the trait of Relentless Resilience emerges, along with three of the efforts we can take in order to develop our own Relentless Resilience.
