HILIPPIA

September, 2011, we arrived at Duke's Children's Health Center for Thomas to give away Sasha Bears. These nearly two dozen bears bought in honor of Thomas from a family friend, a *Scentsy* consultant, were donated so Thomas could share them with other children in treatment for Childhood Cancer at Duke.

Thomas and the Social Worker met children in the Day Hospital and Clinic and Duke Children's Hospital who were receiving treatments. Also, the Child Life Specialist spent time with Thomas and took a couple of bears for some children who were not present that day.

Being the journalist, I could not help but think back on the incredible journey we had traveled since June. As we walked the too familiar halls, passed the elevators and PICU and Step Down Units that consumed us, I remembered the days before and after surgery and the tubes, machines, procedures, weeks of radiation. So many crucial decisions happen when a nine-year-old boy is diagnosed with a malignant brain tumor.

As I watched Thomas give bear after bear away, my heart celebrated the goodness and greatness of God! He was healing Thomas in many ways; prayers answered, side effects diminished, energy improved. Wearing his Duke Medicine T-shirt and matching bandanna covering his bald head, Thomas smiled his way along the halls, meeting each child at eye level. There were children both older and younger than him. There were those who suffered with multiple problems after their surgeries. There were some who remained in isolation during chemotherapy, some who returned to stay in the hospital over and over. They all wore their own scars.

Today, I ponder the generous miracles of God thirteen years ago. God provided so much! I wonder, just how much has God entrusted to Thomas and us? How will we ever be able to give enough back to express our gratitude?

Every year brings a brain scan, but Thomas continues to remain cancer free. An Eagle Scout, honor student, confirmation and Youth group leader in his church in Boone, he graduates in May from Appalachian State with a degree in Psychology. This fall he begins graduate school for Clinical Mental Health with plans to work as a Child Life Specialist. From the one who has been given much, much is required.

From that long-ago day, an vivid image remains etched in my mind. A two-year-old named Dillion, unable to talk because of a brain tumor, said it all without speaking: he smiled, hugged the bear, then he signed: THANK YOU!
