TAKE IT WITH YOU

Keep Discovering God.

Don't become complacent because you've come to church for a long time and know a lot of scripture verses and have listened to a lot of sermons. Bible study - both corporate and private - worship, prayer, and fellowship are ways that we discover God and having done it for a long time is wonderful and important. But there is no finish line. There is no end-ofterm exam where we can prove we know all the right answers about God. Knowing God is much more complex than that, and it is a lifelong endeavor.

Think of it like this (it's not a perfect metaphor, but go with me): you know your spouse. But you continue pursuing the relationship, because there is always more to learn, to realize, to discover. The same can be said for any number of relationships: friends, parents, siblings, etc. We don't spend time with the people we love in order to gain academic, objective knowledge. We spend time with them in order to know them fully, in every sense of the word.

The same is true of our relationship with God. We seek to know God as fully and deeply as our limited, human minds and hearts possibly can. We need to remain curious, open to the Holy Spirit revealing truth or shedding light on a perspective we've not understood or fully grasped before, or even deepening an understanding. For instance, I've always known that God loves me, but until I became a parent myself, I didn't fully comprehend the depth of that love. I'm not sure that I do even now, or ever will. But through my love for my children, God revealed a bit more of His love for me.

As Pastor Benge has laid out the elements of discipleship, the first part is to discover God. It's all too easy for those of us who have been familiar with God for a long time to think that we have checked that box on the checklist. But, may we all, regardless of the length of our Christian journey, enter this place of worship actively seeking to discover God each week.
