# **TAKE IT WITH YOU**

I grew up in a small United Methodist church in a small town in the foothills of Virginia, oldest son of a Choir Director, my mom, and Bass in the church choir, my dad. As a child, during Sunday worship my brothers and I would sit with a Sunday School teacher or friend of our parents. It was rarely the adult keeping watch over us, however, that scared us into right behavior. The choir loft seemed so far away, yet somehow Mom's eagle eye and Dad's grimace could see everything, to include wayward thoughts and intent, it seemed. Without speaking to one another they would communicate across the distance, "We saw that," and "We WILL 'talk' about this when we get home." And they were always on the same page!

Getting up to "use the restroom" (You kids know what I'm talking about) in the service only worked so many times, if at all, so I was glad for so many things to count in our sanctuary to help pass the time, especially during the sermon: stained glass windows, panels in each stained glass window; number of exposed, thick wooden rafters, number of triangles in each rafter created by bracing; number of chandeliers. You get the picture. For much of my childhood there was no hour in the week any longer than the one between 11am and 12pm on a Sunday morning. Even so, there were moments of magic and wonder that captured my heart and imagination.
