1 Timothy Chapter 1 – Part 3 Chapter 2

- II. Negative Instructions: Stop the False Teachers
 - G. Encouragement to contend with earnestness (v. 18-19)
 - 1. there were hopes that were on Timothy's life
 - 2. Paul instructs him not to betray the trust
 - H. The possibility of shipwrecked faith (v. 19-20)
 - 1. some rejected causing "shipwreck"
 - 2. 2 were excommunicated
 - 3. there was a rejection of faith and practice
- III. Positive Instructions: Repair the Church (2:1-6:10)
 - A. Prayer in Public Worship (v. 1-8)
 - 1. petition, worship prayer, intercessory, gratitude
 - 2. these should be made on behalf of all people
- *Paul specifically mentions praying for the "kings, and for all that are in authority"
 - The Roman Emperor at the time of writing was Nero
 - killed his mother in AD 59 (written in 62 or 63)
 - emptied the treasury, made it back using violence and cruelty
 - Nero was responsible for several Christians' deaths
 - Paul and Peter were martyred during his reign
 - 3. pray for their lives to be <u>peaceful</u> and <u>quiet</u> (what?)
- *This type of prayer is beautiful and acceptable to God
 - God desires the salvation of <u>all</u> (4)
 - There is 1 go-between God and men, Jesus (5)
 - That Jesus died <u>for</u> everyone and offered <u>to</u> everyone (6)
 - 4. Paul was called to carry the Gospel to the <u>Gentiles</u> and the <u>pagan</u> (7)
 - a. at this time that was still taboo amongst Jews
 - 5. Prayer instructions (8)
 - a. prayer everywhere (and all the time)
 - b. approach God in a <u>pure</u> and <u>holy</u> manner
 - c. without a spirit of contention or anger
 - d. without mental heat or debate

^{*}prayer is brought with <u>proper actions</u> and <u>spirit</u>

^{*}the <u>outward</u> expression of <u>inward</u> understanding
