

Gospel of John Series – That We May Believe

I AM the Light of the World – John 8:3-11

Wednesday, April 1, 2020

Jesus is the Life-Giving and Directing Light of the World (8:12-20)

The Light is FROM God and IS God (v. 16-28)

The day will come when everyone will know that Jesus is the Light, but not all will believe (v. 21-30)

1. What aspect of Sunday's sermon stuck out in your mind?
2. What questions came to your mind during the sermon?
3. If Jesus is universally for everyone (the Light of the World), how should that affect our lives?
4. What was your life in "darkness" like and what changed when you came to the "light of life?"
5. Just as the Festival of Tabernacles reminded the Jews of God's direction and a recommitment to Him, do you have anything in your life to remind you to remain committed to God?
6. What do you think keeps others from knowing that Jesus is God?
7. Why do you think the people who witnessed Jesus' miracles and heard his teaching in person could still reject Him as Lord?

It is significant that John records this scenario after the woman caught in adultery. He uses the imagery of light and the fact of Him being God as a means to prove his right to express grace to the woman. Every scenario that Jesus was in was used as a means to teach.

Jesus was always in the mode to instruct and direct, are we always in a mindset to learn and follow?
