2 Timothy 2 - Disciple in the Making

- II. Paul's Discipleship of Timothy Encouragement to BE...
- *Discipleship definition (on back)
 - A. A "Discipler" (v. 1-2)
 - 1. be strengthened in grace
 - 2. Timothy was first a disciple learning
 - 3. Then he could set it before another who is worthy
- *disciples <u>making</u> disciples that is the <u>end game</u> or <u>cycle</u> Discipleship is:
- 1. commanded by Jesus
- 2. time intensive
- 3. on purpose
- 4. never ending
 - B. A "Single-Minded Soldier and Athlete" (v. 3-5)
- *because discipleship is tough...
 - 1. suffer as a fighting representative of Jesus
 - a. can't get involved in this life
 - b. the goal is to be pleasing to Jesus
 - 2. the winner plays by the rules
- *Paul is stressing complete <u>devotion</u> and <u>endurance</u> in Christian living C. An "<u>Enduring Husbandman</u>" (v. 6-13)
 - 1. Paul paints the picture of the hard-working farmer
 - a. he has first rights to the produce
 - b. spiritual reward for a job well-done
- *Paul calls on Timothy to <u>meditate</u> on the illustrations then summarizes why it is important <u>to be</u> and <u>make</u> disciples
 - 2. Jesus <u>died</u> and was <u>raised</u>
 - a. It was Paul's motivation, his "bonds"
 - b. ...but the Word is not "bound"
 - c. that's why Paul dealt with it all
- *The gospel going out and salvation of others was his life
 - 3. 4 different word plays
 - a. <u>dead</u> with him, we <u>live</u> with him
 - b. suffer with him, we reign with him
 - c. we deny him, he denies us
 - d. If we are faithless he is faithful
- *Jesus's faithfulness is to himself \underline{AND} us that means he will do \underline{as} he has said. He is the unchanging one \underline{cannot} deny himself

*Discipleship — "the process of devoting oneself to a teacher to learn from and become more like them. For Christians, refers to the process of learning the teachings of Jesus and following after his example in obedience through the power of the Holy Spirit. Discipleship not only involves becoming a disciple but of making other disciples through teaching and evangelism." — Lexham Theological Wordbook
